Pastor's Corner

Faith for the long haul . . . Once a person accepts Christ, how do we keep the fire alive?

Recently I came across a sentence that made me stop and think: "the Christian life is a marathon." So naturally the question arises, if the Christian life is a marathon, then how do we keep our faith alive throughout our lives?

That "hour I first believed" we were so excited about the Christian life, wanting to take in all we possibly could. Then with the passage of time that initial burst of enthusiasm begins to weaken; we are no longer excited about our faith—it becomes "hum-drum." Whether we are willing to admit it or not, it happens to everyone, especially when we experience difficult times in our lives.

What we need is a faith for the long haul. Ways I and others have found to keep the fire alive include but are not limited to the following suggestions:

- Regular attendance at worship, Sunday school and other church activities. Each one of us needs the encouragement and support of other Christians. While we might overlook opportunities for fellowship, they are important. It is at such times that we feel connected with other believers. Just knowing that someone cares about us gives us strength to face the challenges of each day.
- Volunteering to help in the church gives us strength to face the challenges of each day.
- Others keep their faith alive by reading the Bible daily, or being a part of a Bible study. Something wonderful takes place when we, with other Christians, read and discuss a passage of scripture

- together. How refreshing it is listening to guestions of persons who are just starting their walk with Christ or just wanting to grow in their faith. Such guestions keep our faith alive as we think about them.
- Sometimes we need to be stretched in ways we've never been before. Try doing something you've never done before, like teaching a Sunday school class or leading a small group. Many of us have convinced ourselves that we could not possibly do that, yet given the opportunity we find ourselves strengthened by the Holy Spirit and treasure the experience that we might have dreaded. When we stretch or reach out to others, our own faith is rekindled.

It's easy to get stuck in a spiritual rut, simply going through the motions. When that happens we have to try doing things differently. Yes, it's true, the Christian life is indeed a marathon.


Smiles and Joys for August
